

UCLan Cyprus: British Higher Education in Cyprus

UCLan Cyprus offers British higher education from its campus in Larnaka, with programmes taught in English across undergraduate, master's and research levels. Students can choose from subjects including business, law, sciences, computing and creative disciplines, with selected programmes also available through distance learning.

Study Options

UCLan Cyprus has four academic schools covering Business and Management, Law, Sciences, and Arts, Media and Communication. Current study options include undergraduate and postgraduate programmes, while Cybersecurity and Data Analytics master's programmes are available both on campus and through distance learning.

PhD Opportunities

Research opportunities are available across a range of disciplines. [WorldStudentAdvisors](#) can help prospective PhD applicants identify appropriate research areas, review the structure and clarity of their proposal and manage the application process. The research ideas and proposal must remain the applicant's own work.

Degrees, Fees and Bursaries

Graduates of eligible programmes receive a double-awarded degree, with two certificates: one from the UK university and one from UCLan Cyprus. The following 2026/27 figures reflect the stated fees after the bursaries described in the current University information.

Programme	2026/27 fee after stated bursary
12-month English Language Foundation	€6,500
Undergraduate	€9,000 per year
Most master's programmes	€9,500
MBA, Cybersecurity or Data Analytics by distance learning	€8,500

Bursaries and scholarships are subject to current eligibility and University conditions. Research degree fees depend on the proposed programme and supervision arrangements, so PhD applicants should obtain the current fee for their individual research application.

Study in Cyprus and the UK

Some undergraduate students may have opportunities to combine study at UCLan Cyprus with study at the UK university, subject to the programme and current transfer arrangements. Students should confirm the options available for their individual course before applying.

Visa and Financial Requirements

Non-EU students who require a Student visa should check the current immigration requirements before applying. Current University information lists a €50 non-refundable application fee, a €5,000 deposit for non-EU/international students and a €210 visa application and Alien Book fee.

Applicants must also provide the financial evidence required for their Student visa application. The current amount and document requirements should be checked before applying.

The Key Message

UCLan Cyprus offers English-taught undergraduate, master's and research opportunities in Cyprus, with programmes across business, law, sciences, computing and creative disciplines. Graduates of eligible programmes receive a double-awarded degree with certificates from UCLan Cyprus and the UK university.

Students should check the programme, mode of study, tuition fee, bursary or scholarship conditions, entry requirements and Student visa requirements for their intended year of study. Opportunities to combine study in Cyprus and the UK should also be confirmed for the individual programme.
