

University of Lincoln: Study, Scholarships and Career Opportunities

The University of Lincoln is a UK public university offering undergraduate and postgraduate programmes, scholarships for eligible international students, pre-sessional English options and careers support. The University received an overall Gold rating in the Teaching Excellence Framework 2023.

Intakes and Study Options

September is the principal intake. January entry is available for selected programmes, particularly at postgraduate level.

Programmes highlighted in the podcast include business and management, engineering and computer science, nursing and health, agriculture and food, law and social sciences, and media and creative subjects. Some programmes also include industry-related learning through placements, specialist facilities, employer links or practical projects.

Tuition Fees, Scholarships and Discounts

Tuition fees and financial support vary by programme and eligibility. Current 2026/27 information includes the following examples:

Item	2026/27 amount
Typical international tuition fees	£16,900 to £22,100
Africa Scholarship for eligible postgraduate taught students	£4,000 or £5,000
International undergraduate scholarship for eligible students	£2,000 per year
Early Payment Discount for eligible students	£1,000
Advance Full Payment Discount for eligible students	£1,500

Scholarships and discounts are subject to current eligibility, conditions and payment deadlines. International students may also be required to pay a tuition fee deposit before CAS arrangements can proceed. The amount, deadline and remaining payment schedule should be checked in the applicant's current offer and University payment instructions.

Pre-Sessional English

The University offers five-week and ten-week Pre-Sessional English and Academic Study Skills courses. Students who do not yet meet the English language requirement for their intended programme may be eligible for an

appropriate pre-sessional course, subject to the University's entry requirements.

Employability and Student Support

Depending on the programme, students may have access to placements, year-in-industry options, employer-led projects, CV and application support, interview preparation and careers guidance. International students can also access academic, accommodation, visa and compliance guidance, wellbeing services, personal tutors and student societies.

The Key Message

The University of Lincoln offers international students undergraduate and postgraduate study across a broad range of subjects, with scholarships for eligible students, pre-sessional English options and careers support. September is the principal intake, with January entry available for selected programmes.
